J. hinnulea or J. bayardae?

There is some confusion on the correct name of *Jadera hinnulea* (*bayardae*). *Jadera hinnulea* has priority over *Jadera bayardae*. This document follows the history of these names and provides text from those documents.

In my "Revision of the genus Jadera, STÅL, 1862", which was published in 1979, I left the name which was given by ELLEN BABCOCK BAYARD when she described the species in 1943. The species at the time had been described in detail and an examination of types and other material showed it to be an independent species. However, this new description had been conducted within the boundaries of a Master's Thesis at the Iowa State College. Unfortunately I did not have access to its printed form. I was informed about this fact, assumed however, that a Master Thesis would be still valid. Another reason to keep the name E.B. BAYARD chose, was the good and detailed description of the species. Furthermore, an inquiry at the Iowa State College showed that E.B. BAYARD did not intend to publish her findings any more. The member of the administrative board, G. SEIDENSTUECKER in Eichstätt, West- Germany, was so kind to point out that manucscripts, which are not published are not considered valid, and that thus my actions were not correct. The name hinnulea is thus invalid, and needs to be changed. Following the advice of G. SEIDENSTUECKER, I suggest Jadera bayardae GOELLNER-SCHEIDING as a new name, and I hope to do the discoverer some justice.
